# This Week Andrew Gaines Disrupting Life Insurance Sales Program Host: Tom McCurry

Andrew Gaines is a Senior Marketing Director for PHP Agency in Pasadena. He will relate to us how the PHP Agency utilizes network marketing and many other innovations to encourage the delivery of financial education and insurance sales to a primarily middle-class set of customers in America.

There has been tremendous growth in the recruitment of millennial agents and their ability to reach out to their peers and families, and Gaines will share some of the numbers. The average PHP Agency agent is a 33-year-old Latina, as opposed to the 60-year-old white male in the rest of the life insurance industry.

The amazing success of this 9-year-old agency has created quite a *buzz* among the major insurance carriers and even offers to purchase the company. Some well-known celebrities/businessmen have either endorsed or invested in the PHP Agency, such as Magic Johnson and Oscar de la Hoya in the last two years.

We find ourselves in an age of disruptors, like Jeff Bezos at Amazon (retailing), and Elon Musk at Tesla (automobiles). Come and hear about the PHP Agency disruption of life insurance sales.



# Possible International Projects in Tanzania

In the last couple of weeks, I have been discussing potential international projects that our Club may want to consider getting involved in or sponsoring. The last two weeks we have looked at possible projects in Cambodia and Nepal. This week, we turn

our attention to Tanzania. Kimmit Haggins and John Frykenberg have proposed a couple of different possible assistance projects there. One is to provide medical assistance in the form of a medical clinic. Another is to teach entrepreneurship and give entrepreneurial training so that graduating university students in Tanzania can start their own businesses. A third possible project is the creation of a deep water well

system for a village. My understanding is that each of these possible projects will be based in Zanzibar, a large island which is a semi-autonomous province of Tanzania.

These projects would require an initial exploratory trip to set the parameters for

a Rotary International Global Grant application, establish local Rotary club support (the most likely candidate being the Rotary Club of Zanzibar — Stone Town), scout the venue location, logistics support, and possible staffing arrangements.

The medical clinic project would be of great assistance to the area, helping to evaluate

and train local people in basic hygiene,





vided me with an article about Altadena Rotary becoming the presenters




of the Summer Concert Season in Farnsworth Park. It will be finding its way to the home page as soon as I figure out how to accomplish that.

ence - which teaches important life skills through the four levels titled: *Play*, Par, Birdie and Eagle, while seamlessly teaching the participants a variety of golf skills. Through this program participants learn to introduce themselves: resolve

- conflicts; set step by step goals; plan for the future; and appreciate diversi-
- 2) Girls Class a class for girls 5-12 taught by female coaches, which provides the participants the opportunity to become a member of the LPGA and USGA Girls' Golf Program.
- 3) Adaptive Class which is designed to work with youth and young adults who have special needs. This program works with other programs such as Ability First, Special Olympics, Via Esperanza and John Muir High School Special Education students:
- 4) **Mulligan Program** like the Mulligan in golf whereby a player has an opportunity to replay a shot without penalty, this program is intended to provide youth additional opportunities in life through

- the game of golf;
- 5) D.R.I.V.E. which stands for Developing Rewarding Inspiring Values for Everyone. This is an activity-based golf program specifically designed for youth involved in organizations such as the YMCA and the Boys and Girls Clubs.

As you can see, this is a wonderful local organization focused on helping our local youth. The program relies on donations, making the commitment that 100 percent of your donations and contributions stay in the Greater Pasadena region. sanitation, food preparation, nutrition, infant care, and other modern health care practices. Faculty from a local hospital here in the San Gabriel Valley are very interested in this project and would be willing to both attend the exploratory trip as well as help finance and staff it.

The entrepreneurial training project would be similar to the Teach the Teachers project which we have been sponsoring in Nigeria. This project would provide basic teaching and curriculum materials to teachers from local universities, and would instruct them in how to teach product/service development, market analysis, costing and budgeting, distribution, marketing and business plan development for new start-up companies.

The water project would involve the construction of a village-wide water system consisting of bringing electricity to the village, drilling a deep bore-hole, installing an

electric pump, and building a water storage tank and distribution system to several access points throughout the village. You may recall that, in February of last year, Dick Ross from the South Pasadena Club gave a presentation at one of our luncheons about the deep-well water project that his club had sponsored most recently in Tanzania. They have done several deep well water projects in the past. The most recent one was completed in December 2015 at the Kigogo sub-village in the Kilimanjaro region of Tanzania. The Rotary Club of Zanzibar – Stonetown has been the local sponsor for water projects in the past. If anyone has any other ideas for an international project, I am happy to write about it here in my weekly column for all members to consider. Please keep in mind that any international project should meet the qual-

ifications for a district matching grant and a Rotary Global Grant. Any proposal for an international project should be submitted in writing at the earliest possible time in July or August to our Club Board of Directors and, if approved, then to our District for a matching grant and then to Rotary International for a Global Grant. 
